How reading a math text is different from reading a novel:

- 1. It's less relaxed.
- 2. You can't skip any words.
- 3. You have to re-read.
- 4. There are lots of symbols with new meanings to learn
- 5. It might help to read it out loud
- 6. Increased critical thinking, double-checking what is written.
- 7. Easier to take notes the organization is more obvious. Taking notes and marking up the book makes it easier to comprehend.
- 8. More active, interacting with the text.
- 9. There's less subtext. It's all explicit and almost nothing is implicit.
- 10. It's much slower.
